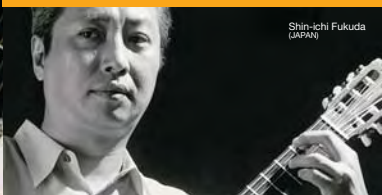

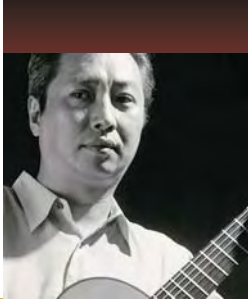

Shin-ichi FUKUDA, starts off by studying the piano and thereafter the Classical guitar at the age of 12 under Maestro Tatsuya Saitoh. After 9 years, he moved to Paris and studied at L'Ecole Normal de Musique de Paris under Maestro Alberto Ponce. FUKUDA graduated from E.N.M.P in 1978 with the premier prix and a performer's diploma.

Since 1978, FUKUDA was awarded many important prizes in France, Italy, Spain and Japan, such as:

- 1978 : First prize in the 1st Carpentras International Guitar Competition (France)
- 1981 : First prize in the 23rd Paris International Guitar Competition (Radio France)
- 1985 : The best prize for his recital in the Osaka Art Festival Award
- 1986 : CD "Invocation & Dance" got The Award of Work of Art sponsored by Japanese Agency for Culture Affairs
- 1986 : Muramatsu's Newcomer Award "The Best Performer of The year"
- 1996 : Shizuoka City Culture Award
- 2003 : CD "Fantasia Sevillana" got The Award of Work of Art sponsored by Japanese Agency for Culture Affairs, again...
- 2007 July : Shin-ichi FUKUDA won "Minister of Foreign Affairs Prize of the year"

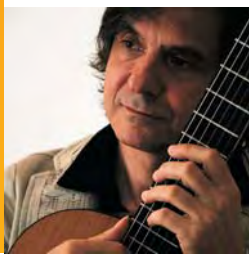
His recent works involving exploration of the nineteenth-century guitar repertoire, using two instruments created at the time, R.F.Lacote 1840 and G.Guadanini 1829. Fukuda's repertoire also includes modern music and new music in a jazz-fusion idiom.

Since 2006, he has hold the position of Honorary Professor in Shanghai Music Conservatory.

Considered by critics as one of the most interesting European guitarists of today, Flavio Cucchi has given hundreds of recitals in America, Europe, Asia and Australia. He also participated in radio and TV shows for some of the biggest broadcasting corporations (BBC, RAI, ZDF, Televisa Mexico and others).

Flavio has played as a guest soloist in more than 30 European cities together with orchestras such as the Orchestra Della Toscana, the English Chamber Orchestra, the Orchestra Toscanini, the Orchestra dell'ATER, and the Basque National Orchestra.

He has also performed in international festivals such as the Festival Estival - Paris, Festival de la Habana - Cuba, Bath Guitar Festival - England, Omaggio a Segovia - Florence, Gendai Guitar- Tokyo, Todi Arte Festival and many more.

He won first prize at the National Competition of Contemporary music, (Chairman Goffredo Petrassi) and is one of the first Italian guitarists to popularize Leo Brouwer's compositions.

In addition to the above, he is also very active in chamber music, and has played the world premiere of Sestina d'Autunno by Petrassi and modern masterpieces by Boulez "Marteau sains maitre" (at the Scala di Milano), Henze's "Cimarron" etc.

Many composers (Alvaro Company, Nuccio D'Angelo, Anthony Sidney, Oliviero Lacagnina, and recently Chick Corea) have been inspired to write for Flavio.

Recently the American Poet Yusef Komunyakaa (Pulitzer prize 1994), dedicated to him "Ode to the guitar" and was presented at Genova International Festival of Poetry.

At 6 years old, Thibault Cauvin began studying classical guitar with his father, Philippe CAUVIN (guitarist and composer). Later, he also studied with Olivier Chassain at the National Conservatory of Bordeaux where he won gold medal and the Medal of Honor which starts his career.

Thibault Cauvin has played with famous orchestras like String Orchestra of Montana (USA), Chamber Orchestra of Coahuila (Mexico) and Albacete Philharmonic Orchestra (Spain). He also played for different TV programs in France, Russia, Morocco and radio stations in France, USA, Sweden, Turkey and Germany. Thibault Cauvin has already performed more than 400 concerts.

Thibault had collaborated with several famous composers (Dusan Bogdanvic, Olivier Chassain and his father Philippe Cauvin) who dedicate their works to him.

Born in Rio de Janeiro, Zé Paulo Becker graduated in Music at Uni-Rio and holds a Master's degree in Guitar from Federal University of Rio de Janeiro. Zé Paulo was awarded first prize at the Concurso Nacional Villa-Lobos (1990).

The turning point in his career took place in 1994, when he focused his attention on Brazilian popular music and played with well-known artists - Zé Renato, Marco Pereira and Lendro Braga among others.

He is a member of Trio Madeira Brasil, a band that stood out at the 1999's Free Jazz Festival. As a guitar soloist, Zé Paulo recorded the CD Lendas Brasileiras [Folk Tales of Brazil] based on popular themes. In March 2004, he launched two CDs in Europe on Luz Azul label, and went on a tour through ten different towns in France.

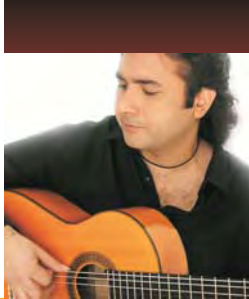
He traveled six times to Europe in 2005, and played in Portugal, France, Switzerland, and Italy. In the same year, he took part in the homage for Baden Powell at Prêmio Tim, and played with musicians like João Bosco and Hélio Delmiro at the Teatro Municipal.

OSCAR GUZMÁN started his guitar studies with "El Moro", Mario Cortes and Manolo Franco. His career as a guitar soloist began at an international level which brings him to five continents such as I Festival de Guitarra de Buenos Aires (Argentina), Festival Internacional de la Guitarra (Lima, Peru), Darwin Guitar Festival (Australia), just to name some.

During all these events, he has shared the stage with some outstanding and renowned guitarists at an international level such as Toto Blanke, Juan Falu, Stepan Rak, Ana Vidovic and Vladimir Mikulka

In August 2000 he was invited to perform a guitar concert at the "V Flamenco Festival im Sommergarten des Pfefferberg" in Berlin (Germany) where he had the special collaboration of Pepe de Lucia. He collaborated in Pedro Sierra's group and performed in various theaters and events such as "XII Bienal de Flamenco de Sevilla" (September 2002) and the Flamenco Cycle "El Flamenco que Viene" (Seville, November 2002).

He accompanied flamenco singer Jesus Heredia, in events such as 'Centro Cultural de la Junta de Andalucia' (Jaen), 'Auditorio Cultural of Mairena del Alcor' and "Homage to Antonio Mairena". Already in the first few months of 2007 he has performed in Hungary, Slovakia, Cyprus, Italy, Australia and the list goes on.

Oscar Guzman has received wide acclaim and praise from audiences and press wherever he has taken his art and his guitar.

The Mexican guitarist Francisco Bibriesca has become in recent years one of the more important classical guitarist of his country. Since 2004, he has performed more than 600 concerts and played to more than 100,000 people, in 18 countries, covering America, Europe, Asia, the Australian Continent and Africa. In the last three years alone, he has performed more than any other classical guitarist from Mexico.

His tours have taken him to the most prestigious concert halls including The Verbruggen Hall in Sydney, The Cairo Opera House in Egypt and so on. He has also recorded programs for the television in the United States of America, Germany, China, Thailand, and Egypt.

- v) Contestant/s must arrive on time for the competition otherwise they will be disqualified
